COVID-19 CORONAVIRUS

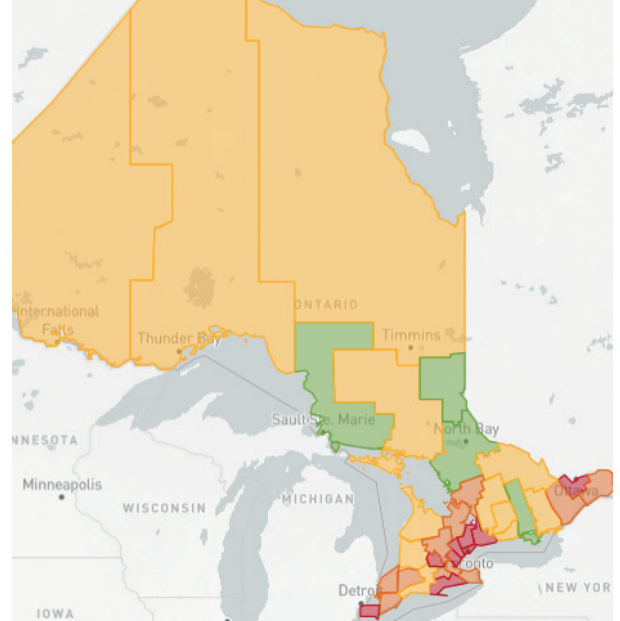
Ontario

As of November 17, there are a total of 109,361 confirmed cases and 3,575 deaths due to COVID-19 in Ontario reported
Compared to the previous day, this represents:

- An increase of 1,478 confirmed cases (percent change of +7.6%)
- An increase of 21 deaths (percent change of +40%)
- An increase of 1,365 resolved cases (percent change of +7.5%)

Timiskaming Health Unit

0 active case in Timiskaming region currently
Change in cases since November 16 is 0
Cumulative case count since the beginning of the pandemic is still 18
Cumulative rate per 100,000 population – 55.1 per 100,000 people
Note for all of North Eastern Ontario, there are currently 35 total active cases (15 in Public Health Sudbury District, 14 in North Bay Parry Sound District Health Unit, 3 in Algoma Public Health/Saulte Ste Marie area, 3 in Porcupine Health Unit/Timmins area and 0 in Timiskaming Health Unit)

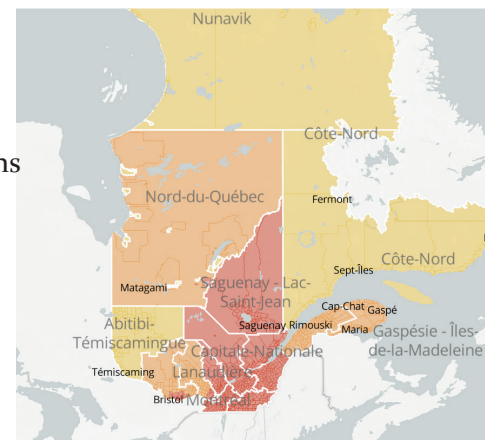
In the past 24 hours, there have been 1 464 new cases, bringing the total number of people infected to 136 894 in the province

The data also report 32 new deaths, for total of 6,947.

The number of hospitalizations increased by 20 compared to the previous day, for a cumulative total of 675. Among these, the number of people in intensive care remains stable, for a total of 90(-3).

TIMISKAMING FIRST NATION SNOW REMOVAL

The TFN Public Works Department is pleased to offer our on-reserve senior members of the community a snow removal service, free of charge to their main residence. This service is also be offered to TFN handicapped members at a reduced rate. Furthermore, the service will be provided to all community service buildings.

Please remember that this is a service we are providing, it is not an obligation on our part, TFN will not be held responsible in any way for accidents or injuries resulting from lack of sand or slippery yards or any damage to properties. The service of snow removal only applies to driveways; Drive-ways will be plowed to allow adequate access to the residence. Additional snow removal (ex. Clearing of large driveways) will be at the home owners' expense.

In order to have a fair system, the criteria are and will be followed as such:
To qualify for this service, you must:

Senior

- Person must be a TFN band member and make request. (As of November 30th)
- Must be the main home owner and reside there.
- Sign an annual agreement with the TFN administration.
- Be 65 years of age or over. (By December 31st of the current year)

Disabled/Handicapped

- A certificate from your doctor. (Stating reason and duration of disability that would prevent physical activity)
- Have no other person physically capable of clearing snow residing with them.
- The service will be offered at a discount rate of \$90.00. (Winter season)

Optional

Sanding of cleaned driveway will be added for additional \$20.00.

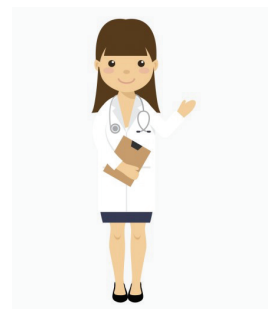

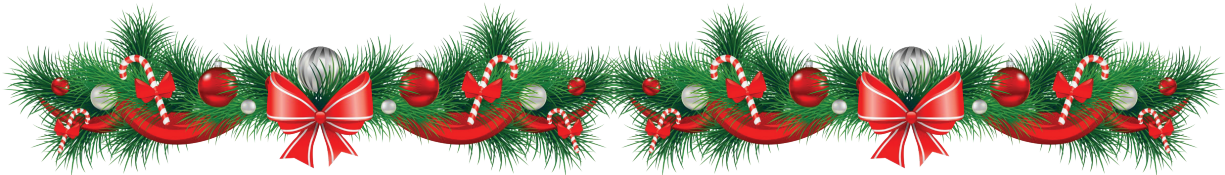

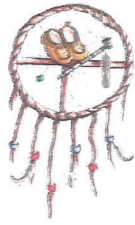

RESOLUTION The Anishnabe Long-Term Care Centre (ALTCC) Board of Directors is replacing a formal annual meeting with the members by this written resolution.

RESOLUTION #11112020

By this Resolution the Board of Directors of the ALTCC reports the following:


1. Since February 12, 2018 the present ALTCC Board of Directors are accountable to manage or supervise the management of the activities and affairs of the Corporation.
2. The ALTCC Board of Directors continues dealings with government owing remittances prior to 2018. A lawyer is negotiating on our behalf to hopefully have late penalty fees waved and set a manageable re-payment agreement.
3. The ALTCC is in the process of getting audits up to date, a challenging process that is not yet completed.
4. The ALTCC Board of Directors continues to work toward providing services and is working on many improvements for not only our residents, but our employees as well.
5. The ALTCC Board of Directors continues to take necessary legal action to protect the future of the ALTCC wherever necessary.
6. The ALTCC Board of Directors has negotiated an important increase in daily per diems through the Assisted Living Program with Indigenous Services Canada, further exchanges are planned.
7. The ALTCC Board of Directors approved by resolution a new Personnel Policy, to replace one that was outdated and no longer fit the new structure and designation.
8. The ALTCC Board of Directors approved by resolution a Code of Ethics that includes a Residents Bill of Rights.
9. The ALTCC has the collaboration and support of Timiskaming First Nation Health and Wellness Centre through the Elders Continuing Care Collaborative.
10. The ALTCC has Emergency Pandemic financial government support through Timiskaming First Nation Leadership and Band Administration.
11. The ALTCC is following all Provincial COVID-19 guidelines, including gathering restrictions.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that there will be no formal meeting with the members.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, this resolution will be filed with Corporations Canada, as part of our annual reporting requirements and we are in our legal board governance rights as a not for profit corporation to do so.





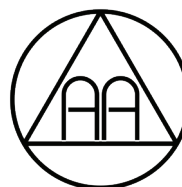

My Records, My Choice

The Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement lets claimants preserve their IAP or ADR records at the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation (NCTR).

INDIAN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL CLAIMANTS MAY CHOOSE TO SHARE THEIR RECORDS OR KEEP THEM CONFIDENTIAL

If you made a claim in the Indian Residential Schools Independent Assessment Process (IAP) or Alternate Dispute Resolution Process (ADR), you have choices:

- Do nothing: your records will remain confidential and then will be destroyed on September 19, 2027
- Get a copy for yourself to keep or share with others
- Preserve your records at the NCTR for history, education and research
- Get a copy for yourself and also preserve your records at the NCTR for history, education and research



Infection Prevention and Control in the Dental Office



Your Dental Hygienist Keeps You Healthy...and Safe!

Have you ever wondered what your dental or dental hygiene office does to keep you safe and healthy? How do they prevent the transmission of infectious diseases?

Dental and dental hygiene offices adhere to some of the highest infection prevention and control standards in the health care field. These standards are set by each provincial regulatory body and must be followed by all oral health professionals. Your dental hygienist starts keeping you safe even before you arrive and doesn't stop until after your appointment is done.

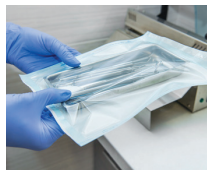


What does the dental hygienist do to prepare for my appointment?

- Cleans all chairs, trays, lights, countertops, handles, and ultrasonic units using disinfectant wipes or spray
- May place single-use barriers on touchable surfaces, such as head rests, light handles, suction devices, handpieces used for polishing, and computer keyboards
- Sets out wrapped, sterilized instruments
- Ensures countertops in the dental operatory are clutter free
- Purges the water lines to ensure they remain bacteria free

What can I expect at the beginning of my appointment?

- Your dental hygienist will wash their hands and put on safety glasses, a new mask, and new gloves.
- Your dental hygienist may also wear a gown and use a face shield.
- Your dental hygienist will open a sterile cassette or pouch of instruments in front of you.
- You may be asked to use a pre-procedural mouth rinse to reduce bacteria in your mouth.



What can I expect during my appointment?

- You will be asked to wear clean safety glasses for the duration of your appointment to prevent eye injury.
- Your dental hygienist may change gloves several times to avoid cross-contamination, especially after touching items like keyboards, pens, and drawers.
- Your dental hygienist may wash their hands or use hand sanitizer several times.
- Your dentist will put on new gloves and a mask before examining your mouth, teeth, and gums.



What else should I know?

- You have the right to question the office on their infection control procedures.
- The cassettes and pouches of instruments are sterilized after every appointment.
- The office keeps records of all sterilization cycles for instruments to ensure that sterilizers are working correctly.
