GENERAL MEETING QUESTIONS RESPONSE

There were many questions posed during the General Meeting on May 18, 2021. Here is information in regards to the questions left unanswered.

First Cobalt Project

TFN already had an exploration agreement with First Cobalt for its exploration activities since 2017 August 2020: First Cobalt contacted TFN to present their refinery project

November 2020:

First Cobalt sent a letter to TFN to inform them a total of 4 permit requests will be submitted to the community for consultation:

- a. Permit to Take Water issued by the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks;
- b. Air and Noise Environmental Compliance Approval issued by the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks;
- c. Industrial Sewage Works Environmental Compliance Approval issued by the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks; and
- d. Closure Plan and Financial Assurance, approved by the Ministry of Energy, Northern Development and Mines;

November 2020: First Cobalt offers to pay TFN to review the upcoming documents. TFN

Accepts

December 2020 to June 2021: TFN is reviewing and analyzing the 4 permit requests

February 2021: Negotiation of an MOU to help TFN monitor the environment

surrounding the refinery. First Cobalt accepts and bonify the budget for

monitoring

May 2021 : Negotiation of a benefit agreement (on-going)

Drilling on TFN territory

In Ontario, mining companies planning to drill must submit a permit request to ENDM (Energy, Northern Development and Mines). That permit is sent to First Nations for consultation. ENDM provides funding annually to help TFN deals with those consultations.

TFN starts negotiating with that mining company an exploration agreement that provides 1 to 2% of annual exploration budget to TFN on an annual basis.

TFN Financial Situation

ISC is completing the analysis of TFN's 2019-2020 audited financial statements but the contact can confirm that TFN's financial ratio, which was -3.41% as of March 31, 2019, has greatly improved to + 5.14% as of March 31, 2020

If you would like to get more information in regards to how the Band is doing financially, please refer to the audit which is available at the Band Office

Section 35 - Electoral Code

Council has consulted the lawyer in regards to this. The process for this is being looked at and Council will be presenting this to the community at a meeting once all the preparations have been made.

Jordan's Principal Designated Official BCR

The BCR is being looked at and will be updated at another date.

Teacher, ECE, and EA Qualifications

For teachers, the qualifications required at Kiwetin School are to be registered with either of the following:

- 1) Ontario College of Teachers
- 2) Quebec Teaching Diploma

All of our teachers currently hold these qualifications except for one member since we had no applicants for the position. In addition, all of our teachers are required to become Associate Members of the Elementary Teachers' Federation of Ontario, which then allows them to be rated, according to their basic and additional qualifications, by the Education Quality and Accountability Office.

Most of the EAs have either their ECE or EA certification. However, there is one EA who does not have a certification but was hired due to the lack of applicants. That being said, she is a top-notch EA and is being encouraged to get her qualifications. Not to mention, she was hired previously as an EA by the previous administration. Also, another EA is completing her second year of studies. The person is not fully qualified as of yet but she has additional skills due to the work she does with one of our students with high needs.

As cited in the TFN Housing By-Law, the following are reminders:

3.3.1 Restrictions

2. No tenant shall modify the rental unit it is occupying, except changes resulting from aging or fair wear and tear of the rental unit or superior force. In the event a tenant does so, he will be required, if the TFN Housing Representative deems it necessary, to bring the rental unit back to its original condition.

3.3.2 Residential Purpose

1. The tenant shall use the rental unit for residential purposes only. No trade or business shall be carried on in the rental unit or the premises without the prior written approval of the TFN Housing Representative.

3.5.3 Maintenance of Rental Unit

2. Every tenant is responsible for the repair of any damages to the rental unit caused by the willful or negligent conduct of the tenant or any person who is permitted on the premises by the tenant. These repairs must bring the unit to the original state of repair and be done in accordance with Industry Standards.

3.5.5 Repair Damages

2. No tenant shall remove from a rental unit any fixtures, sinks, bathtubs, or appliances, and shall not alter, make additions to or affix any item, fixture or thing to the floors. Exterior or interior walls, roof (satellite dishes) or ceiling of the rental unit without the prior written consent of the TFN Housing Representative.

3.5.7 Cleanliness and Overcrowding

1. Every tenant shall maintain the rental unit in a state of ordinary cleanliness. Every tenant shall maintain the land surrounding the rental unit in a good and clean condition and shall be responsible for yard maintenance, including cutting grass, raking leaves and proper garbage disposal. Every tenant shall maintain a healthy and safe environment; by disposing of any abandoned vehicles, any scrap metal, tir3es, chemical waste and any other debris around the yard.



Behaviour



Make Reasonable Rules

- Know what to expect at each age. Children behave and think in different ways as they grow. Learn what to expect at each age. This will give you a realistic idea of what your child is able to do. It can be frustrating for you and your child if you expect too much too soon.
- When your rules are clear, your child is able to understand what you expect. Tell him the reasons for your rules. Your rules need to be the same every day.
- Give clear instructions.

 Tell your child what she can do instead of what she cannot do. For example, instead of "Don't run!" say "Walk!". Instead of "Don't hit the baby!" say "Touch the baby gently." Both you and your child will be happier if you don't have to keep saying "No!"
- Limits grow with your child. Your rules will change as your child gets older. For example, he may have a later bedtime, based on his age. As your child grows, involve him in setting limits.
- Remind often. Young children may not always think of the rules when you want them to. They make a lot of mistakes. Be patient and calmly firm.
- Your child needs your guidance.
 He needs you to be consistent and patient.

Fun & Easy Activities

Simon says...

- This game helps children practice listening carefully and following instructions. It works best with children who are aged 4 years and older. Some 3 year olds may also enjoy it. You can play with just two people or with a whole group.
- The person who is "Simon" stands facing the others. When Simon says, "Simon says touch your cheek," the others touch their cheek. Simon continues giving orders to do different movements. As long as he begins with "Simon says," the others obey him. But when Simon just says, "Touch your toes," for example, no one moves.
- With young children, it is better to play without winners and losers. If someone follows an order when they were not supposed to, just laugh and go on. Take turns being the leader.

A Soundtrack for Your Routines

- Songs are an easy way to remind children of the behaviour that you expect. Children would rather do what the song tells them to do than take orders from you. You can make up new words to a familiar tune. For example, try calling them to lunch with "If you're hungry and you know it, come and eat." Sing it to the tune of "If you're happy and you know it."
- Some children find it very stressful to move from one activity to another. A made-up song like this can help. It changes the mood and gives the signal for what will happen next. Your child will quickly learn to recognize the song. The first two notes are enough for him to understand what you expect. He may even start singing with you. Then he has the whole rest of the song to decide to do what you want him to.

SHARE THEIR RECORDS OR KEEP THEM CONFIDENTIAL

If you made a claim in the Indian Residential Schools Independent Assessment Process (IAP) or Alternate Dispute Resolution Process (ADR), you have choices:

- Do nothing: your records will remain confidential and then will be destroyed on September 19, 2027
- Get a copy for yourself to keep or share with others
- Preserve your records at the NCTR for history, education and research
- Get a copy for yourself <u>and also</u> preserve your records at the NCTR for history, education and research
